Dear Camden County Commissioners and County Manager Erin Burke:

This letter highlights the North Carolina Forest Service's annual accomplishments for Camden County in fiscal year July 2024 - June 2025. The NCFS is responsible for the protection and development of all private and state woodlands in the county per general statutes. Camden County's forestland area consists of 78,447 acres as listed in the 2022 NCFIA survey. Of these acres, 53,802 are owned by nonindustrial private landowners. At this time, I would like to take the opportunity to inform you of our program areas and the accomplishments we made in each area. Jamison Lauria is Camden's Assistant County Ranger and Keith Norman is Camden's Forest Fire Equipment Operator. The Camden County Ranger Position is currently vacant, and we hope to have the position filled in the near future.

Fire Control

We had a higher volume of fire response calls this year compared to last year. NCFS responded to a total of 30 calls in Camden, 19 of these calls were classified as reportable fires. These fires burned only 17.15 acres and we along with the Volunteer Fire Departments protected over \$3,000,000 in property value. NCFS logged a total of 391 equipment hours to both suppress and mop up fires this fiscal year, including the Burnham Rd fire which directly bordered the Dismal Swamp State Park. We are fortunate to have 3 Volunteer Fire Departments in the county, which have and continue to be a tremendous asset to us in wildfire suppression. Their initial attack along with NCFS equipment and staff helps us to manage and minimize fire damage.

Forest Management

With help from our District Office staff in Elizabeth City, we prepared 19 management plans for Camden landowners consisting of 890 acres. These plans help landowners meet financial and personal objectives for their timberland. These plans address timber resources, wildlife, aesthetics, water quality, soil protection, and/or recreation opportunities.

Water Quality Protection

We are also committed to randomly checking on forestry logging operations. All forestry activities must adhere to Forest Practice Guidelines and Best Management Practices. These laws and regulations protect water quality and enable us to utilize forest resources in a sustainable manner. We conducted 3 inspections and 7 re-inspections on loggers for 858 acres of forest harvesting activities in the county. No violations were found during our inspections of the logging sites.

Information and Education

These programs are a vital part of our organization, and they educate the public in forestry and the prevention of wildfires. We conducted 4 programs in the county with other time spent on attending various VFD meetings. Due to Hurricane Helene and NCFS staff being pulled for emergency response some of our I&E events had to be cancelled.

Urban Assistance and Pest Control

We provide Camden citizens with advice and support on shade trees, windbreaks, and insect & disease control. Urban assistance will continue to be a priority as the population increases, and more land is developed. To protect urban and forested areas, each year we conduct aerial and ground surveys for forest pest outbreaks. We continually work with cooperative agencies; NCSU Extension office for shade tree assistance and the North Carolina Department of Agriculture to monitor forest pest movements.

Other Services

We are also involved in overall emergency response in Camden County, the State of North Carolina, and the Southeast Compact. We stand ready for natural disaster recovery efforts such as hurricanes, floods, tornadoes, and ice storms.

Summary

I feel we had a successful year in all program areas. We will continue to deliver effective wildland fire control, offer forest management advice, protect water quality and provide information and educational programs when the opportunity is available. I really appreciate the support of this board of commissioners and our other cooperators in helping us achieve this success. The proposed ordinance presents a text change to the Camden County Unified Development Ordinance. The language is necessary to regulate the Event Venue Use Type in the Principal Use Category Recreation/Entertainment Indoor and Outdoor.

The Text Amendment will amend the Unified Development Ordinance Chapter 151 for the following Article 151.4.4.4.M. Commercial Uses – Event Venue

The Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend approval of UDO 2025-08-201, Text Amendment to the language of the Camden County Unified Development Ordinance Chapter 151 for clarification to specific section of Article 151.4.4.4.M Event Venue, to include 3.0 Acre Lot Size Minimum.

UDO No. 2025-08-201 Ordinance No. 2025-10-01 An Ordinance Amending the Camden County Code of Ordinances Camden County, North Carolina Article I: Purpose The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 151 of the Camden County Code of Ordinances of Camden County, North Carolina, which was originally adopted by the County Commissioners on January 1, 1988, and subsequently revised February 4, 2019 and subsequently amended, and as otherwise incorporated into the Camden County Code. Article II: Construction For purposes of this Ordinance, underlined words (underline) shall be considered as additions to existing Ordinance language and strikethrough words (delete) shall be considered deletions to existing language. New language of proposed ordinance shall be shown in <i>italics</i> and highlighted (bald). Article III: Amending Camden County Unified Development Ordinance, specifically Chapter 151.4.4.4.M Event Venue M. Event Venue – The following limitations are based on the health, safety and welfare of the public. 1. The Purpose and Intent of this Special Use Permit is to regulate new development of an event venue as principle or accessory use for a parcel. 2. Be located at least 500 feet from existing child care centers use type. 3. <i>Be located on a parcel of not less than 3.0 acres in size</i> 4. The Special Use Permits will be updated/reevaluated/reviewed annually to determine compliance with this Ordinance. The applicant must strictly abide by all requirement of the current Unified Development Ordinance of Camden County, North Carolina, and must strictly comply with all other local, state, and federal ordinances, laws, rules and regulations as one or more ordinances, laws, rules regulations may apply to this special use permit. 5. Each event will require Event Application documentation of actions taken for the specific event. 6. Determine Occupancy limitation to be based on all relevant factors including, but not limited to: size of parcel, maximum occupancy load of building, parking limitations, type of event, access, etc. 7. Parking Plan for specific event 8. Requirement of each Event Specific Safety Plan must be in place. These safety measures will be customized for each event and determined by the event's specific characteristics. For example, security personnel, traffic control personnel, fire escape, etc. 9. Limitations on the time and dates for each event determined by Camden County and/or Emergency Management staff. 10. A minimum requirement 50 feet setbacks of all recreation/entertainment features to include but not limited to stages, tents, bounce house, food/beverage trucks, tables/chairs/seating, petting zoo, vehicles (not in parking lot), etc. for event from property lines. The minimum setback for specific features will increase if determined necessary. 11. Limitation on the specific types of events determined by Camden County. 12. Details about maximum occupant load for building(s) determined by Fire Marshal 13. The name, address, contact number of the person (s) responsible for operation of each specific event. 14. Details of catering provided for each event. 15. Specific Details for each event as applicable. a. Sanitation facilities b. Noise control measures c. Crowd control d. Traffic control plan	e. Parking plan f. Relevant information to minimize adjacent property owners being affected g. Other actions taken to eliminate adverse effects. 16. A site plan of event layout. To include but not limited to parking, enter/exit vehicle aisles, pick up /drop off areas, location of booths/catering vehicles, tables, tents, etc. 17. Provide safety fences, up to eight feet high, as necessary to protect the general health, safety, and welfare of public. 18. Fire Marshal/Sheriff approval when applicable. 19. If alcohol is present or being served a valid ABC license required 20. Obtain and remain in compliance with any specific Permits and/or licenses required for all events. 21. If any of the conditions affixed hereto or any part thereof shall be held invalid or void, then the approval in its entirety shall be void and have no effect. Recommendation: Recommend approval of UDO 2025-08-201, Text Amendment to the language of the Camden County Unified Development Ordinance Chapter 151 for clarification to specific section of Article 151.4.4.4.M Event Venue, to include 3.0 Acre Lot Size Minimum.

B. Animal Shelter Services Update – Erin Burke

 MEMORANDUM To: Chair White & Commissioners From: Erin Burke, County Manager Date: October 6, 2025 RE: Animal Shelter Services BACKGROUND The Northeast North Carolina SPCA has closed, and Pasquotank County is preparing to assume the building and start animal sheltering services. Camden County has contracted with the SPCA to provide animal sheltering services in the past. At a special called meeting of the Board of Commissioners on September 16, 2025 the manager was directed to continue conversations with Pasquotank County and also to investigate the potential of establishing an “Holding Facility” in Camden County. ANALYSIS Pasquotank County estimates that the cost of operating a shelter facility will be approximately \$800,000. Using the cost share methodology from the interlocal agreements for Emergency Management and Communications, Camden County pays 21%. This would bring the cost of participating the shelter to approximately \$168,000.00. Costs for the current year would be prorated based on a new shelter opening date. Note under the previous contract with the SPCA this cost was \$50,000.00. During the course of investigating a Camden County holding facility, staff researched pertinent laws and requirements for animal shelters and spoke with the State Veterinarian Dr. Patricia Norris. In this research and conversations staff confirmed that holding facilities are held to the same standards and requirements as shelters. They must meet all the requirements of state law and the Animal Welfare Act as it pertains to heating and cooling, cleanliness, space, exercise, etc. Additionally, Dr. Norris indicated that when starting a sheltering facility, communities typically plan for years before starting construction and operating a sheltering facility. Staff reviewed the current Animal Control Budget for FY 25/26 (attached) and used <i>some</i> of those numbers to develop an estimated operating budget (attached). Salaries were developed from researching average salaries across the state. Details for other line items are provided in the right-hand column of the page. The estimated operating budget for a Camden County owned facility is \$208,957.00. Perhaps harder than estimating operational costs, was estimating capital costs to construct a facility that meets the requirements of the law without being able to engage the services of a design professional. There are a few potential locations on property currently owned by the County for this type of facility so there were no land acquisition costs included in the estimated capital budget (attached). Staff used an online estimator for the cost of a shell building and worked with vendors to get cost estimates for equipment and other items. This type of commercial construction would require the County to engage the services of a design professional to complete a survey, site plan, stormwater plan and building permits. Those costs have been estimated in the budget as well. The capital cost anticipates holding room for five dogs and ten cats with one additional quarantine space for each. [Type here] [Type here] Animal Sheltering Discussion Page 1 of 2	NEXT STEPS The Manager will need the Board of Commissioners to provide direction on how the County would like to proceed with Animal Shelter Services. Pasquotank County is drafting an interlocal agreement, that was not complete at the time of this memo. The Agreement will follow a similar structure to other agreements and should be a three-year term. Should the County wish to move forward with a separate facility we will still need time to plan, construct, and staff that facility and will need an interim agreement to do so. During discussion Manager Burke explained that it would not be her recommendation that the County take on animal shelter services on its own. No action was taken. Manager Burke will bring to the Board the interlocal agreement for discussion and consideration when received from Pasquotank County.

C. Leash Ordinance – Erin Burke

As requested by the Board at the September meeting, staff removed the ambiguity in the leash requirements and specifically enumerated the prohibition of dogs at the Community Park.

DRAFT LEASH ORDINANCE <u>§ 93.42 DOGS ON COUNTY PROPERTY.</u> <u>Any dog on County owned or maintained property must be kept on a leash not exceeding 6 feet long.</u> a. <u>No dogs are permitted at the Community Park.</u> <u>Penalty: See Penalty § 93.99.</u> <u>§ 93.99 PENALTY.</u> <i>(A) Notwithstanding any civil penalties outlined in this chapter, the violation of any provision of this chapter shall be a Class 3 misdemeanor and any person convicted of such violation shall be punishable as provided in G.S. 14-4 and G.S. 153A-123 and may be subject to a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment. Such violation may be punishable by any other applicable law. Each day's violation of this chapter is a separate offense. Payment of a fine imposed in criminal proceedings pursuant to this chapter does not relieve a person of his liability for registration, fees, or civil penalties imposed under or pursuant to this chapter.</i> <i>(B) The animal control officer may cause issuance to an owner or keeper or a person in violation of this chapter or applicable state law, warnings, notices, civil penalties giving notice of violation(s). Any such penalty issued shall impose upon the owner a civil penalty as listed in the county fee schedule. Penalties shall increase for each subsequent offense.</i> <i>(C) Unless otherwise specified in this chapter, all notices or civil penalties required by this chapter to be sent or delivered shall be made by personal service, by first class or certified mail, or by affixing the notice to the last known residence.</i> <i>(Ord. 2001-6-1, passed 6-4-01; Am. Ord., passed 7-6-21)</i>

WHEREAS, the contributions and sacrifices of the men and women who served in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by our citizens; and

WHEREAS, Camden County seeks to honor these individuals who have made countless sacrifices for freedom by placing themselves in harm's way for the good of all; and

C. EMS Temporary (Part-time) Position – Joe Zaller, EMS Director

Background: Camden County EMS currently utilizes a temporary (part-time) staffing pool consisting of 1 EMT, 6 AEMTs, 7 Paramedics (2 Paramedic vacancies). Despite this structure, staffing depth remains limited, resulting in difficulty filling last-minute schedule changes and callouts. Due to the limited pool, Camden EMS has been forced to cover gaps with overtime shifts.

Budget Impact: At present, only 6.3% of the EMS budget is utilized toward temporary/part-time staffing, well below the fiscal benchmark of 23%. No additional salary funding is requested.

Operational Challenges: Recruitment and Retention: Temporary (part-time) EMS staff remain difficult to recruit and retain. Many providers hold full-time EMS jobs elsewhere and often choose overtime shifts with their primary agency instead of straight-time part-time work with Camden. Staffing Depth: Shallow staffing depth, forcing reliance on overtime to cover essential coverage needs. Particularly for last-minute schedule changes. Overtime Reliance: The resulting overtime increases costs, risks staff fatigue, and strains full-time personnel. Retention Need: Despite temporary (part-time) staff limited availability, current temporary (part-time) providers should not be released due to the investment in training, shortage of part time EMS professionals, and the importance of maintaining even limited availability.

Operational Benefit: Increasing the depth of qualified Temporary (part-time) providers will reduce reliance on costly overtime coverage, improve scheduling reliability, and better align budget utilization with projected targets.

Recommendation: Pending the EMS Advisory Board’s approval on October 1, 2025, request approval of Two (2) additional temporary (part-time) EMS provider positions with certification flexibility: Positions intended for Paramedics recommend maintaining flexibility to Advanced EMT candidates when availability, experience, and candidate quality provide the best fit.

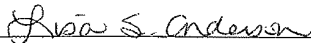
