B. EMS Community Paramedic – Joe Zaller

Summary

Camden County Emergency Medical Services has been awarded \$299,839.50 through the North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Services (NCOEMS) Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) to establish a Mobile Integrated Health / Community Paramedicine (MIH/CP) Program serving Camden County.

The grant-funded program will expand access to healthcare services through proactive, community-based interventions designed to:

- Improve continuity of care following EMS encounters;
- Reduce avoidable emergency department utilization;
- Strengthen behavioral health crisis response;
- Support patients experiencing substance use disorders;
- Improve chronic disease management and post-discharge follow-up; and
- Enhance healthcare navigation and community resource coordination.

Grant funding will support:

- One full-time Community Paramedic position;
- Salary and employee benefits;
- A dedicated Community Paramedicine response vehicle;
- Cardiac monitor and advanced medical equipment;
- Mobile communications and technology infrastructure;
- Mobile radio and computer equipment;
- Training and professional development;
- Patient education and healthcare navigation resources; and
- Operational expenses necessary to establish and sustain the program.

Background

The Rural Health Transformation Program is administered by the North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Services to expand Mobile Integrated Health and Community Paramedicine services in rural communities. Camden County EMS successfully competed for this funding by proposing a comprehensive Community Paramedicine program focused on improving access to care and reducing unnecessary EMS utilization through:

- Behavioral health crisis follow-up;
- Substance use disorder and overdose follow-up;
- Frequent EMS utilizer intervention;
- Post-hospital discharge visits;
- Fall prevention and home safety assessments;
- Chronic disease education and management;
- Community resource coordination; and
- Healthcare navigation and referral services.

The proposed program aligns with the goals outlined in Camden County EMS’s grant application and budget narrative and is intended to strengthen healthcare access while improving patient outcomes in Camden County.

Community Paramedic Position

Position Title: Community Paramedic
Employment Status: Full-Time, Grant Funded
Proposed Schedule: Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

The Community Paramedic will coordinate Mobile Integrated Health activities and provide direct patient care and follow-up services throughout Camden County.

Primary responsibilities include:

- Behavioral health follow-up;
- Overdose and substance use disorder outreach;
- Post-discharge follow-up visits;
- Chronic disease management;
- Fall prevention assessments;
- Care coordination;
- Community education and outreach;
- Healthcare navigation; and
- Program data collection and performance reporting.

The position is fully funded through the initial grant period ending October 30, 2027. Continuation beyond that period will be contingent upon the availability of renewal funding or other funding sources and any approvals required by the Board of Commissioners.

Request

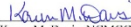

 Resolution 2026-07-01 RESOLUTION ADOPTING A FUND BALANCE POLICY WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Camden County recognizes the importance of maintaining a prudent level of available fund balance to ensure the County's financial stability, creditworthiness, and ability to respond to unforeseen emergencies, economic fluctuations, and revenue shortfalls; and WHEREAS, the Board further recognizes its responsibility to ensure that public funds are utilized effectively and that excessive accumulation of unrestricted fund balance may result in resources being held beyond the immediate needs of County operations; and WHEREAS, the North Carolina Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act requires local governments to maintain sound financial management practices; and WHEREAS, the Board desires to establish a formal policy defining both minimum and maximum target levels for General Fund balance. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Camden County the intent to maintain an Available General Fund Balance between thirty-five percent (35%) and eighty percent (80%) of the subsequent fiscal year's adopted General Fund operating expenditures. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED if the Available General Fund Balance falls below thirty-five percent (35%), the County Manager and Finance Officer shall present to the Board of Commissioners a plan to restore fund balance to the minimum target level within a reasonable period not to exceed three fiscal years, unless extraordinary circumstances warrant a longer recovery period. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED if the Available General Fund Balance exceeds eighty percent (80%), the Board of Commissioners shall evaluate appropriate uses of the excess balance during the annual budget process. Such uses may include: a. One-time capital expenditures; b. Capital reserve funding; c. Debt reduction; d. Pay-as-you-go infrastructure investments; e. Economic development initiatives; f. Tax rate stabilization or reduction; or g. Other non-recurring expenditures deemed appropriate by the Board. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED nothing in this policy shall require the Board to expend fund balance solely for the purpose of reducing the balance below eighty percent (80%) when extraordinary circumstances, anticipated capital needs, pending litigation, natural disasters, economic uncertainty, or other significant financial risks justify maintaining a higher balance.	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Board may temporarily suspend or deviate from this policy by resolution upon finding that extraordinary circumstances exist, including but not limited to natural disasters, public health emergencies, significant economic downturns, major infrastructure failures, or other events affecting the financial stability of the County. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all prior resolutions or parts of resolutions conflicting with the provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed, superseded, and replaced to the extent of such inconsistency. 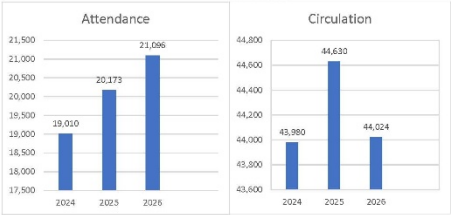
